The invited speaker for the fifth seminar is [Larry Wolff](#), Silver Professor of History at New York University, author of numerous publications on the history of Central and Eastern Europe, including *Woodrow Wilson and the Reimagining of Eastern Europe* (Stanford University Press, 2020).

The seminar will be chaired by [Frank Sysyn](#), University of Alberta (Canada).

In the second part of the event, there will be a Q&A section with questions from the audience. The seminar is held in Ukrainian and English with simultaneous translation.
